Regulatory Landscape under Trump

- From Inauguration Day until the end of May, OIRA approved only 15 major regulations
 - During the same period of <u>Obama's administration 93 rules</u> were approved, and during <u>Bush's Administration 114 rules</u> were approved.
- <u>Executive Order (EO) 13771</u> Enforcing the Reg Reform Agenda creates 2-for-1 rule on any new regulations and EO 13777 enforcing the Reg Reform Agenda requires agencies to identify regulations for repeal.
- 860 regulations to be pulled or suspended under the Trump Administration's Unified Agenda of Regulatory and Deregulatory Actions released in July.
 - 469 will be completely withdrawn.
 - 391 set aside or reevaluated.










Major Regulations Fall Off a Cliff

The Fix to the Vaccine Bank (Farm Bill)

- Ask to improve the Foot Mouth Disease (FMD) Vaccine Bank.
 - USDA to establish off-shore vaccine bank.
 - Today, vaccine available to deal with a small, localized outbreak.
 - Requesting \$150 million annually through 5-year Farm Bill for bank.
 - Asking for \$70 million a year for National Animal Health Laboratory Network, which runs FMD tests; \$30 million for block grants to states to respond to FMD outbreak.

 - Puts livestock haulers in difficult position
 - HOS Rules Incompatible With Livestock Industry
- Strategy

Compliance Mandate: December 18, 2018

March 18, 2018

FMCSA Actions

- 90 Day Waiver GRANTED Ag Commodities
- Guidance on 150 Air Mile Exemption
 - What is an Ag Commodity
 - What is a source of a commodity
- Action on NPPC Exemption Petition
 - FMCSA Decision Expected in Early Mid February
 - Potential 2-3 Year Exemption
 - Industry Needs to Work on Training, Prep and Development of Device









Air Emissions

Legal

Stay of Mandate: November 17, 2017 January 22, 2018
 January 19th EPA sought additional 90 days. Waiting on Court to issue new deadline

Reporting Guidance

- Clarify ACA Still In Force
- Clarify Reporting Unit Under CERCLA Population Density & Sensitive
- Eliminate Follow Up Reporting

- Eliminate D&B #s
- Population Density & Sensitive Ecological Conditions

NPPC Tax Reform Priorities

- 1. Maintain cash accounting
- 2. Eliminate the estate tax, maintain stepped-up basis
- 3. Lower taxes on capital investments
- 4. Lower rates
- 5. Simplification









NPPC Engagement and Study

- Commissioned study with K-Coe Isom
 - Began project in May
 - Utilized 7 representative farms
- Treatment of rates positive, expansion of business expensing even more so
 - Lack of permanence, NOL carrybacks, DPAD potential issues
- Bottom line: both plans should be a marginal net positive for pork producers

Guestworker Act (Ag Act) Rep. Goodlatte

- NPPC backing bill that would create H-2C visa for nonseasonal workers.
 - Sponsored by House Judiciary Committee Chairman Bob Goodlatte, R-Va.
 - Would allow 450,000 foreign workers, including 40,000 for packing plants.
 - Workers allowed to remain in U.S. up to three years, and defers portion of pay as incentive for "touchbacks" one month for every year to their home country.
 - Puts USDA, rather than Labor Dept., in charge of program.









No Regulation without Representation

- HR 2887 Rep Sensenbrenner WI
- Drafted in response to state ballot initiatives and regulations
- Neil Dierks, NPPC CEO, testified July 25,2017


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U.S. Free Trade Agreements Lead to Increased Opportunities for Pork Exports

Annual U.S. Pork Exports












Trade Agreements Create Opportunities for U.S. Agriculture












U.S. Exports More Pork to 20 FTA Countries than Rest of World Combined












Free Trade Works-Importance of NAFTA, KORUS Abundantly Clear

NPPC Trade Policy Priorities

- Protect pork exports to Mexico and Canada
- Protect pork exports to Korea
- Protect pork exports to China
- Negotiate FTAs in the Asia Pacific Region beginning with Japan.
 - Vietnam (90 million/\$5,000), The Philippines (98 million/\$7,800), Malaysia (30 million/40%/\$22,500), and Indonesia (250 million/13%/\$9,200) also important. (For perspective Mexico 122 million/\$16,100.)
- Open markets closed to U.S. pork such as Argentina, Brazil, India and Thailand
- Support FTA negotiations with the UK
